GET TO KNOW YOUR "MATISSE" STREET ARTIST

HENRI MATISSE (1869-1954)

Henri Émile Benoît Matisse was a French artist—he was a draughtsman, printmaker, and sculptor—but he is primarily known as a painter. Matisse is commonly regarded as one of the artists who best helped to define the revolutionary developments in the visual arts throughout the opening decades of the twentieth century, responsible for significant developments in painting and sculpture.

The intense color of the works he painted, between 1900–1905, brought him notoriety

as one of the *Fauves* (wild beasts). Many of his finest works were created in the decade or so after 1906, when he developed a rigorous style that emphasized flattened forms and decorative patterns. In 1917, he relocated to the French Riviera, and the more relaxed style of his work during the 1920s gained him critical acclaim as an upholder of the classical tradition in French painting. After 1930, he adopted a bolder simplification of form. When ill health in his final years prevented him from painting, he created an important body of work in the medium of cut paper collage.



ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW COMMITTEE (ARC)

The Architectural Review Committee (ARC) meets on the first Friday of every month to review all of the Architectural Improvement Requests (AIRs) submitted. Any alterations you want to make to your landscape or

home's exterior requires you to fill out and submit an AIR, which requires Committee approval before proceeding with the work. Failure to receive approval could result in fines.

Montage Entrance Gates—Last month we had the entrance gates at Gerald Ford and Da Vall painted, and we have received many positive responses regarding the upgrade. The design decision to use one color was to dial back the visual vibration and distraction of the two contrasting colors and make the simplified gates a more current and quieter architectural element, allowing them to blend in more subtly into the background as homeowners and visitors enter and exit the

community. As a result of this color change some of the other architectural elements, such as the stonework and entry fountains have become more accentuated.

Perimeter Lights—Perimeter palm lights, as well as new spotlights on our entrance palms should be installed later this month.

Perimeter Palm Replacement—Later this month we are having three palms removed and replaced along Gerald Ford. This is part of our Palm Replacement Master Plan.



We continue to encourage all homeowners to keep us informed of any issues that you identify which can help us to maintain and improve the overall look of our community.

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS COMMITTEE

The **Committee** met on February 9, and Barbara Little joined as a new member, and was warmly welcomed. The **Emergency Preparedness Committee** discussed the following actions:

1. Recommend that the Board consider moving the community gathering place after a major quake from the end of Chagall Court, where access is restricted, to a location with a single entrance and exit. We are suggesting the area around the "Detention Basin" at the corner of Van Gogh and Da Vinci. This area has dual ac-

cess, is near the Da Vall gate, has sight lines along two major streets, and is close to our Bulletin Boards, where all official



notifications are posted.

2. Agreed to seek information on the cost and timing of replacing the "blue reflec-

tion lights" in the center of the streets near every fire hydrant, at least one of which is no longer firmly secured and one of which has been shattered.



3. Agreed to develop a checklist for each owner to use in preparing in advance for a major earthquake, and in securing basic supplies for use immediately after one. This list would be included in the *Welcome Packet* and emailed to all homeowners for posting in a prominent place (perhaps inside a cabinet door or the pantry door) for quick reference.



- 4. Agreed to contact **SoCal Gas** to get information regarding gas shutoff valves (automatic as well as manual) that can be shared with our homeowners.
- 5. Agreed to establish contact with the City of Cathedral City official(s) who currently manage disaster relief for the larger community, in order to get updated information on Cathedral City plans, policies and procedures after an earthquake.

The Board recently approved establishing an ad-hoc **Montage Rules Committee**. This is the first major update effort since 2016.

I want to thank the following homeowners who have volunteered to serve on this Committee: Jean Feigenbaum, Thomas Harp, Jean-Guy Poitras, Jo Ann Horwitz, Gail Kramer, David Leytus, and Norm Giere.

The goal is to review the current *Montage Rules & Regulations*, along with our Board Policies, to determine whether any changes, additions, or deletions are appropriate. Recommendations will then be submitted

to the Board for consideration of adoption. If approved, the revisions will be submitted to all homeowners for a 30-day comment period.

The Committee has held two ZOOM meetings, where we established ground rules. We are diligently reviewing each rule and developing revised language where appropriate for final review and approval in due course. We are also reviewing other HOA rules to identify best practices and consider incorporating into our documents.

MONTAGE BOARD OF DIRECTORS ELECTION

March is election season in the Montage at Mission Hills Homeowners Association. Each homeowner should have received their ballot package in late February. If you believe you did not receive a ballot package, or have misplaced your ballot package, please immediately contact either Shelly Ruegsegger (SRuegsegger@ppminternet.com) or Caren Olivia (Caren@ppminternet.com) at Personalized Property Management—by email or phone 760-325-9500.

Ballots must be returned by mail in the special envelopes provided in the ballot package by March 18, or delivered in person to the home of the HOA Inspector of Elections between March 19th and 10:30 am by March 20th. Instructions on returning the ballots are provide in the election package.

The ballots returned by the March 20th General Meeting are importantly used to establish a quorum for the purposes of calling the Annual General Meeting to Order. If not

enough ballots are received the meeting cannot be called Official and business cannot be conducted until a new meeting is called at a later date. Even if members do not plan to attend the virtual meeting via **Zoom**, please still return your ballots with your vote for Board members, approval of the 2020 General Meeting Minutes, and approval of the transfer of surplus 2020 operating funds to the 2021 operating budget.

Upon determination of a quorum, the ballots will be opened and counted during the March 20th General Meeting and the results announced.

GERALD FORD BIKE LANES COMPLETED

The installation of one mile of five-foot-wide Class II bike lane markings along Gerald Ford Drive between Date Palm Boulevard and Da Vall Drive was completed by City contractors in early February. The new bike lanes pass the Montage Gerald Ford Gate and connect to the Rancho Mirage Class II bike lanes running east and west on Gerald Ford Drive. It is now possible to ride a bike from Montage to the UCR and Cal State San Bernardino Campuses on Cook Street in Palm Desert and beyond. Peddling west to


Date Palm you will soon be able to turn south on Date Palm and connect with the CV Link Class I bikeway running east along the Whitewater River all the way to Palm Springs.

LOOK OUT FOR BIKERS

With the installation of the new bike lanes Montage residents will need to be cautious of bike riders using the new bike lane, by carefully timing your turns into the Gerald Ford gate as appropriate. Under state law, bike riders have the right-of-way when they are in designated bike lanes.

The City of Cathedral City is about to begin updating the City's General Plan which will provide Montage residents and the Board the opportunity to provide input on the need to include continuation of the Da Vall Drive Class II bikeway between Gerald Ford Drive and the Frank Sinatra Drive bikeway, and linkage to the CV Link Trail at Frank Sinatra Drive and the Whitewater River.
